Thomas Edward Shortsle, age 74 of Paris, passed away on the evening of Wednesday, April 20, 2016. A funeral service will be held in his honor Monday, April 25th at 11 AM at Janowicz Family Funeral Home-Remus with Pastor Chris Rietz officiating. Burial will follow at Wambolt Cemetery-Remus. Visitation will be held at the funeral home on Sunday afternoon from 3 PM to 6 PM and again on Monday from 10 AM to the time of service.




