Edmore - Constance Maxine Van Houten, age 76, of Cedar Springs passed away at Green Acres of Lowell on Friday, May 21, 2021. Connie was born May 29, 1944, the daughter of Samuel Smith "Smitty" and Orma Maxine (Ashbaugh) Van Houten at Mt. Caramel Mercy Hospital in Detroit, MI.

She was raised in Edmore and graduated from Edmore High School. Connie later graduated from Central Michigan University. She became a Physical Education teacher and taught and coached students at Grandville Schools for 41 years. She was a long-time member of the First Baptist Church in Greenville, MI.
